

(GCA) 18 U.S.C. § 922(g)

- (g) It shall be unlawful for any person—
- (1) who has been convicted in any court of, a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year;
- (2) who is a fugitive from justice;
- (3) who is an unlawful user of or addicted to any controlled substance . . . ;
- (4) who has been adjudicated as a mental defective or who has been committed to a mental institution;
- (5) who, being an alien . . . ;
- (6) who has been discharged from the Armed Forces under dishonorable conditions;
- (7) who, having been a citizen of the United States, has renounced his citizenship;
- (8) who is subject to a court order that . . .
- (B) restrains such person from harassing, stalking, or threatening . . . ; or
- (9) who has been convicted in any court of a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence,

to ship or transport in interstate or foreign commerce, or possess in or affecting commerce, any firearm or ammunition; or to receive any firearm or ammunition which has been shipped or transported in interstate or foreign commerce





Federal Regulation of Firearms

Mailing of Firearms Act of 1927 (MFA)

- First successful federal criminal regulation
- Prohibited shipping concealable firearms
- Only applied to firearms shipped through the USPS

National Firearms Act of 1934 (NFA)

- First comprehensive firearm regulation
- Imposed heavy taxes on making or transferring firearms

Federal Firearms Act of 1938 (FFA)

- First actual restrictions on the sale, transportation, or receipt of firearms
- Created classes of persons

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
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Possession

- Actual Possession
 - Direct Control
- Constructive Possession
 - Power and Intent to Control



Henderson v. United States, 575 U.S. 622 (2015).

Henderson v. United States, 575 U.S. 622 (2015)

"\$922(g) would prevent Henderson from disposing of his firearms even in ways that guarantee he never uses them again, solely because he played a part in selecting their transferee. He could not, for example, place those guns in a secure trust for distribution to his children after his death. He could not sell them to someone halfway around the world. He could not even donate them to a law enforcement agency. Results of that kind would do nothing to advance \$922(g)'s purpose."

- Notice of Government Action
- Opportunity to be Heard



Proposed Solution

- 2. Rebuttable Presumption Against Future Possessory Interests for Acquisitions Without Consideration

14-Day Statutory Grace Period

- Allows limited time to manage interests via:
 - Place in Trust
 - Sell
 - Otherwise Dispossess

Rebuttable Presumption Against Future Possessory Interests


- Acquisitions without consideration, such as:
 - Community Property
 - Inheritance

Public Policy Considerations

- Incentivize compliance
- Attempts to address:
 - Arbitrary and Inequitable Enforcement
- Harms to families by leading to worse outcomes in:
 - Education
 - Family Wealth Building
 - Career Progression
